

Reading Blog Feeds

There is a large amount of useful information being published on the internet in the form of blogs and news updates. It is a good idea to keep up to date on relevant information. The best way of doing this is to set up one application which lists updates to your chosen feeds. This means that you do not need to visit each site individually. Each blog or news update will have a RSS feed associated with it. RSS stands for **Really Simple Syndication** or **Rich Site Summary**

There are a number of applications that you can use to read RSS feeds. You will need to register for the applications separately. The available applications include:

- igoogle
- Google Reader
- Newswire
- Outlook 2007 & 2010
- Mozilla Firefox
- Safari

On the iphone, recommended RSS readers include

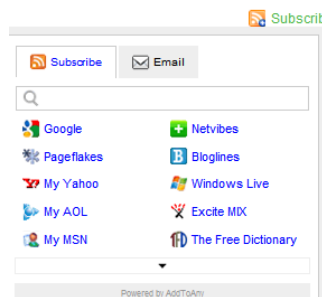
- RSS Reader (free and pro available)

Many sites display a small icon with the acronyms RSS or XML to let you know a feed is available.

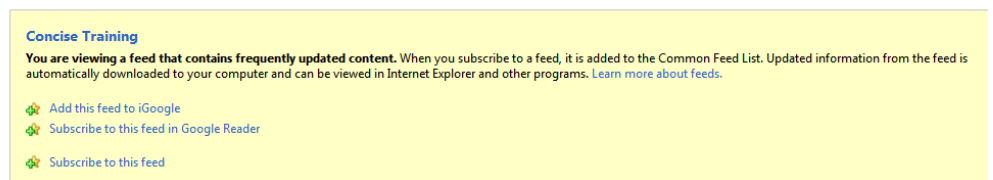


Once you have registered for an application, you will need to add the RSS feed. For example,

1. Access www.concisetraining.net
2. Select RSS icon
3. Click Subscribe
